To organize different community based health care programmes in the backward villages with a view to bring a lasting improvement in the health, hygiene, sanitary condition, safe water of the poor villagers. 4. To undertake integrated Child Development Programme, Reproductive Healthcare Programme, Mother & Child Care Programme, Child Education, Nutrition Promotion Programmes in the backward villages. 5. To improve the environment and ecology in the rural area by taking up different protection programmes. Tree plantation and renewable energy will be emphasized upon to bring sustainable change. 6. To organize relief and rescue programmes during the period of natural calamity. 7. To promote Art, Education, Science and Research, Charity, Women and Child Development, Sports,

Social Welfare, Religion and Animal Care. 8. To protect Environment, Forests, and Nature.

(b) *Matters which are necessary for furtherance of the objects specified in clause 3(a) are

1. To establish, maintain, and run educational institutions, including schools, colleges, and training centers for primary, secondary, and higher education.
2. To promote the advancement of education in rural and underprivileged areas through the development of schools, libraries, and vocational training centers.
3. To establish and operate healthcare institutions, including hospitals, clinics, and mobile healthcare units, to provide affordable healthcare services.
4. To organize health awareness programs and provide medical aid for life-threatening diseases and conditions to the poor and needy.
5. To run programs for nutrition, immunization, and maternal and child health care in rural and urban areas.
6. To promote the study and dissemination of information in the field of agriculture through research, training, and farmer support programs.
7. To organize and conduct training sessions on organic farming and sustainable agricultural practices for small and marginal farmers.
8. To provide free seeds, tools, and other agricultural inputs to underprivileged farmers to enhance their productivity.
9. To promote sports and physical activities by establishing and maintaining sports academies, gymnasiums, and playgrounds.
10. To organize sports events, tournaments, and competitions to promote physical fitness and youth development.
11. To run skill development programs aimed at youth and women, enabling them to obtain employment in various sectors.
12. To provide free training in arts, crafts, music, dance, and other cultural activities for the promotion of cultural heritage.

To establish and manage libraries and information centers to provide access to knowledge and learning resources. 21. Encourage schools, colleges, corporates, and local communities to participate in mass tree-planting events. 22. To promote gender equality and fight against gender-based violence through advocacy, education, and legal aid. 23. To promote and implement initiatives that support environmental conservation, climate change awareness, and sustainable ecological practices. 24. To provide skill development and training programs for employees to enhance their professional growth and career opportunities. 25. To offer computer literacy programs and IT training to bridge the digital divide and enhance employment opportunities. 26. To develop and implement vocational and job-oriented training programs for youth and unemployed

individuals. 27. To encourage participation in sports and recreational activities for physical and mental well-being. 28. To promote awareness and advocacy for fundamental human rights, equality, and justice for all. 29. To provide immediate assistance, rehabilitation, and reconstruction support during natural and man-made disasters. 30. To undertake projects that improve infrastructure, social welfare, and economic empowerment of communities. 31. To support sustainable agricultural practices, food security programs, and nutrition awareness campaigns. 32. To work towards ensuring justice, equality, and fairness in society by advocating for marginalized and underprivileged groups. 33. To create employment opportunities and promote income-generating activities for economically weaker sections. 34. To provide support services such as health, education, and welfare schemes for disadvantaged communities. 35. To establish and manage facilities for elderly care, providing shelter, healthcare, and emotional support. 36. To provide guidance, mentorship, and opportunities for youth empowerment and personality development. 37. To protect and promote the rights of children by providing education, healthcare, and shelter to those in need. 38. To promote environmental conservation, implement pollution control measures, and spread awareness about climate change, waste management, and eco-friendly practices. 39. To rescue, rehabilitate, and provide long-term care for abandoned, stray, injured, or abused animals and cows, and to establish shelters, veterinary facilities, and sanctuaries for their protection and well-being. 40. To promote animal welfare

through awareness programs, community education, advocacy against cruelty, and by supporting and collaborating with animal protection initiatives, campaigns, and movements. 41. To undertake and promote organic farming practices, including the cultivation, preservation, and propagation of endangered plant species, and to encourage eco-friendly methods of agriculture for sustainable development. 42. To conserve and protect nature and the environment by initiating projects and activities aimed at saving forests, plants, and natural resources, thereby ensuring ecological balance and environmental sustainability. 43. To undertake and promote social welfare activities for the upliftment of society, including support for the poor, needy, disadvantaged and marginalized sections of the community through education, health, sanitation, awareness and humanitarian initiatives. 44. To establish, maintain and support gaushalas and related facilities for the protection, care, shelter and welfare of cows and other stray or abandoned animals, and to promote compassion towards animals in accordance with ethical and cultural values. 45. To promote spiritual growth, moral values and ethical living among people through discourses, meditation programs, yoga, cultural activities and awareness programs without discrimination of caste, creed, religion or gender. 46. To promote, preserve and propagate religious, cultural and traditional values through peaceful and non-profit activities such as religious gatherings, prayers, festivals, spiritual education and cultural programs for public benefit. 47. To establish, develop, renovate, maintain and support temples and other places of worship for spiritual

and cultural purposes, and to facilitate activities connected with prayer, devotion and public religious harmony on a non-profit basis. 48. To do all the work which is in the interest of humanity and to Provide justice to humanity.

Provided that the company shall not support with its funds, or endeavor to impose on, or procure to be observed by its members or others, any regulation or restriction which, as an object of the company, would make it a trade union.

5 (i) The profits, if any, or other income and property of the company, when-so-ever derived, shall be applied, solely for the promotion of its objects as set forth in this memorandum.

(ii) No portion of the profits, other income or property aforesaid shall be paid or transferred, directly or indirectly, by way of dividend, bonus or otherwise by way of profit, to persons who, at any time are, or have been, members of the company or to any one or more of them or to any persons claiming through any one or more of them.

(iii) No remuneration or other benefit in money or money's worth shall be given by the company to any of its members, whether officers or members of the company or not, except payment of out-of-pocket expenses, reasonable and proper interest on money lent, or reasonable and proper rent on premises let to the company.

(iv) Nothing in this clause shall prevent the payment by the company in good faith of prudent remuneration to any of its officers or servants (not being members) or to any other person (not being member), in return for any services actually rendered to the company.

(v) Nothing in these clauses (iii) and (iv) shall prevent the payment by the company in good faith of prudence remuneration to any of its members in return for any services (not being services of a kind which are required to be rendered by a member), actually rendered to the company

Once at least in every year, the accounts of the company shall be examined, and the correctness of the balance-sheet and the income and expenditure account ascertained by one or more properly qualified auditor or auditors

10 If upon a winding up or dissolution of the company, there remains, after the satisfaction of all the debts and liabilities, any property whatsoever, the same shall not be distributed amongst the members of the company but shall be given or transferred to such other company having objects similar to the objects of this company, subject to such conditions as the Tribunal may impose, or may be sold and proceeds thereof credited to the Rehabilitation and Insolvency Fund formed under Section 269 of the Act.
